Arrive in Dublin

Meet your MCI Tour Manager, who will assist the group to the awaiting motorcoach for a panoramic tour of Dublin's highlights including St. Stephen's Green, Merrion Square, Liffey Footbridges, Grafton Street, Temple Bar, O'Connell Street, and Phoenix Park. Also visit Dublin Castle. Dublin Castle once functioned as a military fortress, a prison, treasury, courts of law and the seat of English Administration in Ireland for 700 years. Dublin Castle is now used for important state receptions and presidential inaugurations Late afternoon hotel check-in

Dublin is Ireland's capital and its largest, most cosmopolitan city. It wasn't before the Viking raids of the 9th century that Dublin was fully established. The "boom years" came in the 18th century and the city expanded across the river forming a new Dublin of stately squares, streets and Georgian mansions. Afternoon at leisure for shopping or to take part in an optional activity offered to each choir (choirs choose one)

Option 1: Excursion to Glendalough and the Wicklow Mountains. The













steep wooded slopes of Glendalough the "valley of the two lakes" harbor one of Ireland's most atmospheric monastic sites, established in the 6th century. Here, we see the Round Tower, Cathedral, St. Kevin's Cross, and Gatehouse Option 2: Travel north to the picturesque maritime village of Malahide for some time in the village or on the beach. Here, we will visit Malahide Castle, one of Ireland's oldest and most historic castles. Return to Dublin via Howth Option 3: Visit the Guinness Storehouse. Visitors will discover what goes into the making a pint of Guinness - the ingredients, the brewing process, the time, the craft and the passion. Following the tour, enjoy a pint of Guinness. Continue the tour with a visit to the Teeling Whiskey Distillery, Dublin's newest whiskey distillery. Walk through the history of Dublin distilling before taking the tour of the operational distillery. Enjoy the Craft Whiskey Comparison at the ultimate taste test

Option 4: Visit the GAA Museum established to commemorate, recognize and celebrate the GAA's enormous contribution to Irish sporting, cultural and social life. Exhibits share insight into the origins of hurling, Gaelic football and the role played by the GAA in the Irish cultural revival and nationalist movement. Also take a tour of Croke Park Stadium that recreates the experience of the magic of a match day at one of the most historic and modern sporting arenas in the world. Enjoy a skyline tour at Croke Park Stadium. Ascend to a walkway 145 feet above the ground to take in views of the Irish Capital from five different viewing platforms

### Day 6 Sunday, June 28 Dublin / Belfast (B,D)

Morning transfer to Belfast for a guided tour including the leaning Albert Memorial Clock tower (Irelands answer to the Tower of Pisa), the Opera House, The Crown Bar (dates from 1885), Queens University, the Botanic Gardens, Shankill and Falls Road and Belfast City Hall

Afternoon visit to Crumlin Road Gaol. Grasp the wonderful opportunity to experience the history inside the former prison, Crumlin Road Gaol which dates back to 1845. See the execution cell where 17 men were executed between 1854 and 1961. Also see the Governor's office and the restored cells of C wing. Walk along the underground tunnel that links the Gaol to the courthouse where the prisoners were led to the Gaol after being sentenced *Performance as part of the American Celebration of Music in Ireland*

Belfast, capital since 1920 of the six counties of Northern Ireland, is an important industrial city and port. It lies beautifully situated on Belfast Lough in the northeast of Ireland, at the mouth of the River Lagan. The central pedestrianized area on the west bank of the River Lagan makes a pleasant place to stroll. The magnificence of its 19th century buildings earned the city the soubriquet "Athens of the North"
